BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER NAVIGATION PROGRAM

January is Cervical Health Awareness Month. LMAS is sharing some preventative and screening measures to prevent and detect cervical cancer.

Nearly 14,000 women in the U.S. are diagnosed with cervical cancer each year. HPV immunizations, recommended at ages 11-12 and available as early as age 9, protect against the types of HPV that cause about 90% of cervical cancers. Routine screening is also critical. Pap tests beginning at age 21 can find cervical changes early, when treatment is most effective.

The Breast and Cervical Cancer Navigation Program at LMAS helps eligible individuals access screening and diagnostic services. Those who are ages 21-64, uninsured or underinsured, Michigan residents, and within income guidelines may qualify. This program helps remove cost barriers and supports early detection and better health outcomes.
