To obtain a license, the following shall be completed:

- 1) Complete and submit the **Sewage System Installer License Application**.
- 2) Complete and pass a written examination. After documents have been submitted, the Department will schedule an examination date. The examination is in a multiple-choice format. Passing grade is 70% or better. If a score of 70% or better is not achieved, he/she may re-take exam no less than 30 days from the initial exam date (re-exam fee applies).
 - a) *Contractors who have a current license in another county using the **Superior Code (prior to April 1, 2022)** or **The Upper Peninsula Environment Health Code (effective date of April 1, 2022)** will not be required to retake test if a copy of current license along with most recent passing test score and/or proof of continuing education units from your licensing health department are attached to the LMAS licensing application.*
- 3) Submit required fees:
 - a) License fee (3 year): \$90.00
**Fee will be pro-rated based on when application is received. Contact your local LMAS office to determine the fee at time of application.*

Notes:

- 1) License is valid during a three-year licensing period (currently Jan 1, 2026–December 31, 2028).
- 2) The license will allow a contractor to work in the following counties: Luce, Mackinac, Alger, and Schoolcraft.
- 3) Renewal of license. The examination can be retaken or you can claim *continuing education credits (CEUs)* in lieu of exam. If claiming CEUs, eighteen hours of credits during the three-year license period is required. Credits can be obtained by attending the yearly training sessions put on by LMAS or Chippewa County Health Departments. Attending appropriate training put on by MOWRA, NOWRA, MDEQ, MSU, etc. will be accepted for credits. *It is your responsibility to keep track of credits earned and submit the information to LMAS.*
